"But In Fact"

Rev. George Schuessler

"But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died. For since death came through a human being, the resurrection of the dead has also come through a human being; for as all die in Adam, so all will be made alive in Christ." (1ST Cor. 15:20-22) The Apostle Paul knows what he is talking about. He is an eye witness to the risen Lord Jesus. (Acts 9:5) Paul did not meet the "Son of Man", because Saul was not yet born. Remember, Saul was renamed Paul by the risen Christ Jesus.

"But in fact" is important to Paul and to all of us. The Apostle Paul is not spreading idol talk of rumors. He is a witness to the crucified and risen Jesus Christ. Paul also knows that it takes some convincing for others to believe. Therefore Paul writes the 15TH chapter in his letter to the Corinthians noting some of the many other witnesses to the crucified & risen Jesus.

"But in fact" more than Biblical writers speak about Pontius Pilate and Jesus Christ. Early Jewish as well as Christian historians write about both Pilate and Jesus. To top this off, even the Roman historian and politician, Cornelius Tacitus also writes about Pilate and Jesus. Thus it must be very real these characters of Pilate and Jesus, of a Roman governor holding trial and a person named Jesus being crucified and risen from the dead. The Biblical account is real and supported by historical writings of Roman, Jewish, and Christian perspectives.

But all of this is of no value unless you believe it to be true. Is Jesus Christ the resurrected and ever living Lord of Life? Saul encountered the risen Jesus while seeking to destroy the early Christian community, but he died the Apostle Paul who believed and was proclaiming Jesus Christ as the risen and ever living Lord of Life.

Historical writings continue to pile up. Archeology continues to unearth evidence. The Christian Church still proclaims Jesus Christ as the risen and ever living Lord of Life. Google it and you may be surprised by the "facts". Christianity is no myth, it is for real, and yes, it will make a difference in your life now and forever.

CARPIO CHURCH COUNCIL

The Carpio Lutheran Church Council meeting was held on March 3rd, 2024 at 6pm. The meeting was called to order by President, Jeff Moen. Pastor George opened the meeting with a prayer.

The Secretary's report was given by Tammi Moen. Jeff Moen motioned to approve the minutes as presented. Kenny Trail seconded, motion carries.

The Treasurer's report was given by Heather Feland. The checking account balance as of February 29th is \$18,746.39. Lenten offering will go into the general fund. Jeff Moen motioned to change the salaried employees to 1099's instead of W-2's. Kenny Trail seconded, motion carries. Kenny Trail motioned to stop paying Eric Huber for janitorial services and start paying Heather & Greg Feland \$400 starting in March and to pay a 1 time payment of \$500 for January and February. The special projects checking account has been opened with Heather Feland and Erica Moen as managers. Heather will drop Quick Books and continue the bookkeeping with spreadsheets.

CLCW Report: The personal care kits will be put together after Easter.

Pastors Report: The Pastor has made 103 in-person contacts during February. February 1st, he made visits at Souris Valley Care in Velva. February 2nd, he made visits to Mountrail Bethel Home in Stanley. February 6th, the Pastor helped with the food truck delivery and made visits at Trinity Homes in Minot.
