The Council meeting was held on October 2, 2024 at 7:30 pm. The meeting was called to order by President, Jeff Moen.

The Secretary's report was given by Tammi Moen. Jeff Moen motioned to accept the minutes as presented. Crystal Eide seconded, motion carries.

The Treasurer's report was given by Heather Feland. Cathy Armstrong motioned to accept the report as presented. Kenny Trail seconded, motion carries.

Pastor's Report: Pastor George had made 93 in person contacts from September 1st thru September 30th. The Pastor officiated the Allie Deaver memorial service at Zion on Septemer 13th. On September 17th, the Pastor met with Sheri Meyer to plan the memorial and burial service for Shirley Morrison to be held on June 14, 2025. He also made visits at Edgewood in Minot and Souris Valley Care in Velva. On September 23, he made visits in the rural Carpio area. On September 27th, the Pastor made visits to Mountrail Bethel Home in Stanley and Somerset in Minot. On September 28th, he made visits at Edgewood Vista in Minot. On October 5th, the Pastor met with Ally Bauer & Trever Hanlan to plan their upcoming wedding at Zion. The Pastor will officiate the wedding for Grace Burke & Rylan Bachmeier at Zion on October 19th. The Pastor will hold a First Communion Class for children in grade 3 and older at Zion. The First Communion will be during worship on November 24th.

New Business: The council reviewed the Joint Council meeting with Zion. Brad Dokken, the Assistant to the Bishop, met with the councils to discuss our options of the SAM program, TEEM program or putting out a Call. A special thank you to Greg & Heather Feland for trimming the bushes and trees around the church. And also, a special thank you to the Maury Askvig family for the use of a truck to haul the branches. Kenny motioned for the Pastor & Ladora to take Greg & Heather for lunch and to purchase a gift card for the Askvig family. Jeff Moen seconded, motion carries. SEPTEMBER 29, 2024, 1PM JOINT CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING

Meeting called to order by Assistant to the Bishop, Pastor Brad Dokken.

Pastor Brad led us in a word of prayer.

Council members present: Drew Bryantt, Nicki Shelkey, Klint Hanson, Chad Schweitzer, Curt Schumaier, Gary Gathman, Rachel Schieve, Alechia Neubauer, Corine Christman, Tammi Moen, Jeff Moen, Crystal Eide, Heather Feland, Pastor George, Pastor Brad and Kylene Hornberger.

Pastor Brad spoke about his background and him and his wife's role in the ELCA congregation. He then went into discussion about the call process, the TEEM program, and the SAM program.

The following items are the areas of concern within Western ND and seminary:

- 1. Currently 25 parishes in our area without a Pastor.
- 2. Very low numbers in the seminary.
- 3. Since 9/1/22 only one Pastor has been placed in our area.
- 4. Barriers to Western ND as looked at by a candidate; isolated, extreme weather, lack of social systems, conservative state.
- 5. Currently 6-8 weeks out for pulpit supply.

Five years ago, the call process changed. TEEM: Theological Education for Emerging Ministries was established. It is a leadership formation process where candidates can do schooling online and work half time within the churches. The process takes 3-5 years to complete and after this time they would become an ordained pastor within the ELCA. The candidate would make ½ to 2/3 of current full time salary wages during this intern period.

Heather Feland, Carpio Lutheran congregational member was present to speak about herself and her calling within the church. She will be going through the TEEM program and would like to train under Pastor George.

Pastor George expressed his wish to continue working but in a part-time capacity. He stated he did not state he was fully retiring but wanted to step back due to health issues. According to the Western ND Synod, Pastor George had not filed paperwork for his retirement.

Pastor Brad was under the assumption he was only at the meeting to discuss roles that Heather and Pastor George would fulfill moving forward if the joint congregations voted for this arrangement. Questions from the council members concerning the retirement announcement, wages, what it would look like and what would be best and if there would need to be a vote from the congregation, were discussed.

It was decided that a question-and-answer congregational meeting would take place on Sunday, October 6 during the church service at Zion.

Meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

CONGREGATIONAL MEETING MINUTES - 10/06/2024

Congregational meeting was called to order by President Chad Schweitzer. The meeting was held immediately following the shortened regular church service.

The purpose of the congregational meeting was to update the status of Pastor George and his retirement plans.

Pastor George has stated that he had not announced full retirement that he only intended to step down to parttime. The synod is sending him paperwork according to his part time retirement plans.

Discussion took place regarding Heather Feland becoming a part time student/pastor in the Carpio/Zion churches. Pastor George would be mentoring Heather as she moves through the TEEM program.

Pastor stated that the church had 4 options:

- 1. Call a new pastor out right
- 2. Enter in the SAM (synod authorized minister) program
- 3. Enter in the TEEM program
- 4. Accept his part time work

Council member, Rachel brought up the email from Pastor Brad that our only option as a congregation was to accept his part time status and Heather as student. We cannot ask Pastor to retire completely.

Members of the congregation brought up the following issues/concerns/comments:

- 1. Concern about lack of church members.
- 2. Why do we have a council if the synod is going to tell us what we should and should not be doing anyway?
- 3. Do we have Heather and Pastor George the entire 4-5 year process and do we have to "call her"?
- 4. Do you get to choose where you would like to go in the call process?
- 5. What does a half time pastor mean: what would it look like, what are the obligations of the pastor and student?
- 6. What would the pay package look like"?
- 7. The members would like to see someone that is more involved in the youth and areas around the church?
- 8. We have a strong congregation that steps up in times of need and feel confident that we would do okay without a pastor while the call is placed.
- 9. Sunday School is struggling and concern if we don't have a pastor then we will lose more members and children.
- 10. Clear trend of attendance that is the direct result of Pastor George. No longer come to Zion Lutheran.
- 11. Social aspect of life has a lot to do with why people are not going to church. Go to church for Jesus not Pastor.
- 12. Many texts or calls from members who state they will not be coming back to the church as it stands now.

Meeting was adjourned.

OCTOBER 13, 2024, NOON JOINT CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING

Meeting called to order by Zion Council President Chad Schweitzer.

Council members present: Drew Bryantt, Nicki Shelkey, Klint Hanson, Chad Schweitzer, Gary Gathman, Rachel Schieve, Alechia Neubauer, Corine Christman, Tammi Moen, Jeff Moen, Crystal Eide, Heather Feland, Kenny Trail, Kathy Armstrong and Pastor George.

Chad Schweitzer led a discussion as to what people were thinking in the light of Pastor George's voicing he will be retiring at the end of 2024. There was talk about the traditional calling of a Pastor, and the Theological Education for Emerging Ministries (TEEM), and the Synod Authorized Ministers (SAM). Heather Feland was asked many questions regarding the TEEM and SAM program and what role she would be willing to take on within the congregations of Zion and Carpio as she pursues becoming an Ordained Pastor in the ELCA. She did voice a preference for the TEEM Program.

The Joint Councils Members thought it would be a good idea to have Heather Feland lead two worship services so that people in the congregations could get to know her better in the public role of leading worship. Oct. 27 and Nov.17 were chosen as the two Sundays for Heather Feland to lead worship. Pastor George agreed to this taking place and noted that Heather Feland should be compensated for the two Sundays at the Synod Guidelines for Pulpit Supply.

Chad Schweitzer voiced a concern to get guidance from the Zion Congregation in a formal meeting before the Zion Church Council recommends or approves any kind of decision on ministry for 2025. Klint Hanson moved to hold a Zion Congregation Meeting to present information and to help direct the Zion Council to proceed with one of the possible choices for getting a Pastor, like the traditional route of Calling an Ordained Clergy person from the Clergy Roster, or the pursuit of Theological Education for Emerging Ministries (TEEM), or the use of a Synod Authorized Minister (SAM) in some form. Second by Alechia Neubauer. Motion Carried.

Meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.
