FROM MINISTER HEATHER

Dear Friends of Berthold and Carpio Parish,

September fields, heavy with grain, gold stretching to the horizon as the dust clouds fill the sky with the harvesters are rolling through. Gardens in our backyards are coming to a close, with so much bounty. There's something about this time of year that slows us down just enough to notice: things are ripe. Things are ready. The work of the growing season is at its fullness. I think that's exactly where we find ourselves as a parish family this September—Berthold and Carpio together. We've spent a season growing, sometimes quietly, sometimes without even realizing it. And now, as the air starts to cool and the harvest is here, it's a good time to pause and ask: what has God been growing in us? And how do we care for that growth as we move into a new season of parish life?

But if I'm honest, September doesn't always feel like harvest joy. It feels like busy. School schedules kick back in. Fall sports, meetings, harvest work in the fields, the slow fade of long summer evenings—it all comes at once. And in the middle of that rush, it's easy to feel a little like a branch that's drifted from the vine. Not cut off entirely, but stretched thin. Distracted. Running on our own root system instead of the one we were grafted into. Maybe you've felt that pull already, the sense that worship gets pushed to "whenever there's time," that connection with your church family becomes one more thing on a crowded calendar. I don't say that to add guilt to your list. I say it because I think most of us feel it, and it helps to know we're not alone in it. The good news is, Jesus already knew we'd wrestle with this. And he gave us a picture that speaks directly into it.

In John 15, Jesus tells his disciples, "I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in them will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing" (John 15:5, NRSV). I love how simple and how honest that image is.

A branch doesn't produce fruit by trying harder. It doesn't grit its teeth and force growth through sheer determination. A branch bears fruit because it stays connected—because the life of the vine flows into it, through it, and out into fruit that feeds others. That's true for us too. Our worship, our service, our love for one another as a parish—none of it comes from us gritting our way through a busy September. It comes from staying joined to Christ, the true vine. When we abide in him—through worship, through prayer, through the sacraments, through simply showing up and being fed by Word and community—the fruit takes care of itself. Gratitude grows. Connection grows. Love for neighbor grows. Not because we forced it, but because we stayed rooted.

Here's what I find beautiful about this image for us specifically: Berthold and Carpio are two congregations, two communities, two sets of pews and parking lots and coffee pots—but we share one root system. We are branches off the very same vine. That means the harvest we're celebrating this September isn't Berthold's harvest or Carpio's harvest. It's ours, together. When one congregation gathers in gratitude, the whole vine is nourished. When we serve together, pray for one another, and show up for each other's joys and struggles, we're simply living out what was already true the moment we were grafted into Christ: we belong to each

other because we belong to him. So as the harvest comes in around us this month, let's give thanks not just for full grain bins and garden baskets, but for the fruit that's grown in us as a joint parish—the friendships, the shared ministry, the quiet acts of care that don't always make it into a bulletin but are very much the work of the vine growing through us.

As we step into September together: stay rooted in worship. As schedules fill up and the pace of life picks up speed, don't let worship be the thing that gets crowded out. It's not one more obligation on the calendar—it's the very connection to the vine that makes everything else possible. It's where we're fed, where we're reminded whose we are, and where our roots go down deep enough to weather whatever the season brings. Whether you find yourself in the pews at Berthold or at Carpio this month, know that you are joined to the same vine, nourished by the same grace, and growing toward the same harvest. May this September find you rooted, and may the fruit of gratitude, love, and community grow abundant among us.
